PUBLIC NOTICE

TRANSIT OIL PRODUCTS TO BE RE-EXPORTED WITHIN 30 DAYS

Kenya Revenue Authority has observed an increase in the number of applications for extension of transit period in respect of transit oil products destined to the EAC Region. Notwithstanding the reasons for non delivery of such products within the legally provided for period of thirty (30) days, the net effect is a severe slowdown in product evacuation from the Kipevu Oil Storage Facility (KOSF). This in turn not only clogs the KRA Systems, but indeed affects timely product discharge at the Kipevu Jetty.

In an effort to address this unacceptable situation, KRA will strictly enforce the provisions of Regulation 104 of the East African Community Customs Management Act (EACCMA).

Oil marketers are therefore notified that with effect from 14th January 2011, the Authority will not grant any extension of transit period beyond the allowed period as specified under Regulation 104(4) of the said Act.

Where the period allowed expires before the entire product is lifted, the outstanding product will be deemed to be uncustomed and hence subject to the legally provided for enforcement measures including mandatory localizations.

Oil marketers are therefore encouraged to evacuate their products within the required timeframe to avoid any inconveniences.
